Thriving

*"I've got this!
Yes, I can!"*

Can manage and express emotions effectively most of the time

Able to develop/maintain positive relationships with others

Able to regulate use of devices

Has a "can do" spirit

Maintains a balanced lifestyle with physical activity and sufficient sleep

Able to regulate mood and expressions of negative emotions

Coping

*"Most times, I'm ok!
Sometimes, things don't feel ok."*

At times, finds it difficult to manage emotions but able to express these feelings

With some help or reminders, uses strategies (e.g. Taking deep breaths, positive self-talk) to manage stressful moments

Able to form some positive relationships

With help or reminders, able to regulate use of devices

Does not always sleep sufficiently, moodiness sets in when tired

Struggling

"I can't seem to do it, urgh."

Has meltdowns or becomes withdrawn when experiencing an overflow of emotions

Is often irritable, sulky or struggles to hold a calm conversation with others due to impatience, frustration or tiredness

Avoids social interactions and is reliant on device interactions instead

Sends or posts moody and/or depressing messages on social media

Often struggles to fall asleep, hence moody and weary

Unwell

"I can't do this, or I don't even know why I feel like this. I give up."

If you notice your child exhibiting signs of social-emotional struggles (see 'Struggling' column) and your efforts to reach out to provide support have been unsuccessful, it might be time to seek help for them.

Support can come from a family friend, a counsellor or a healthcare professional.

Help is available, you and your child are not alone. Start with speaking to the school.

#1 KNOW

Knowing where our child is along the continuum is an important first step. Our understanding and empathy will support his/her social emotional well-being.

#2 C.A.R.E

One way to support our children's well-being is to develop their social-emotional skills. Let's also practise C.A.R.E.

Chat: Make time for one-to-one conversations- this shows our children that we value their thoughts and feelings, that they matter to us.

Affirm and encourage them. Tell them you are proud of them when they make and act on responsible decisions.

Role-Model: Show, not tell. Our children learn best from watching our actions.

Empower: Give our children choice and hone their problem-solving skills

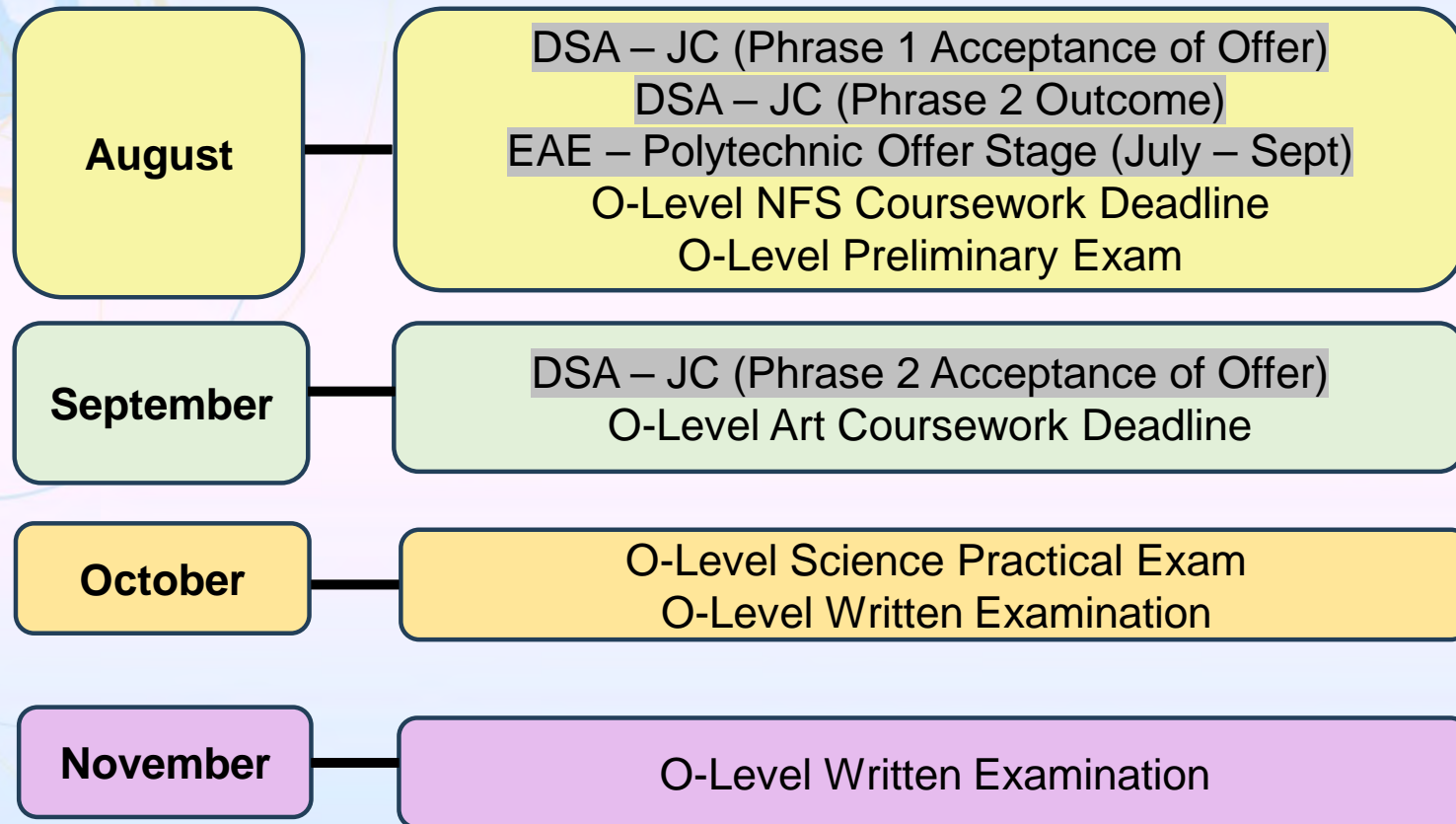

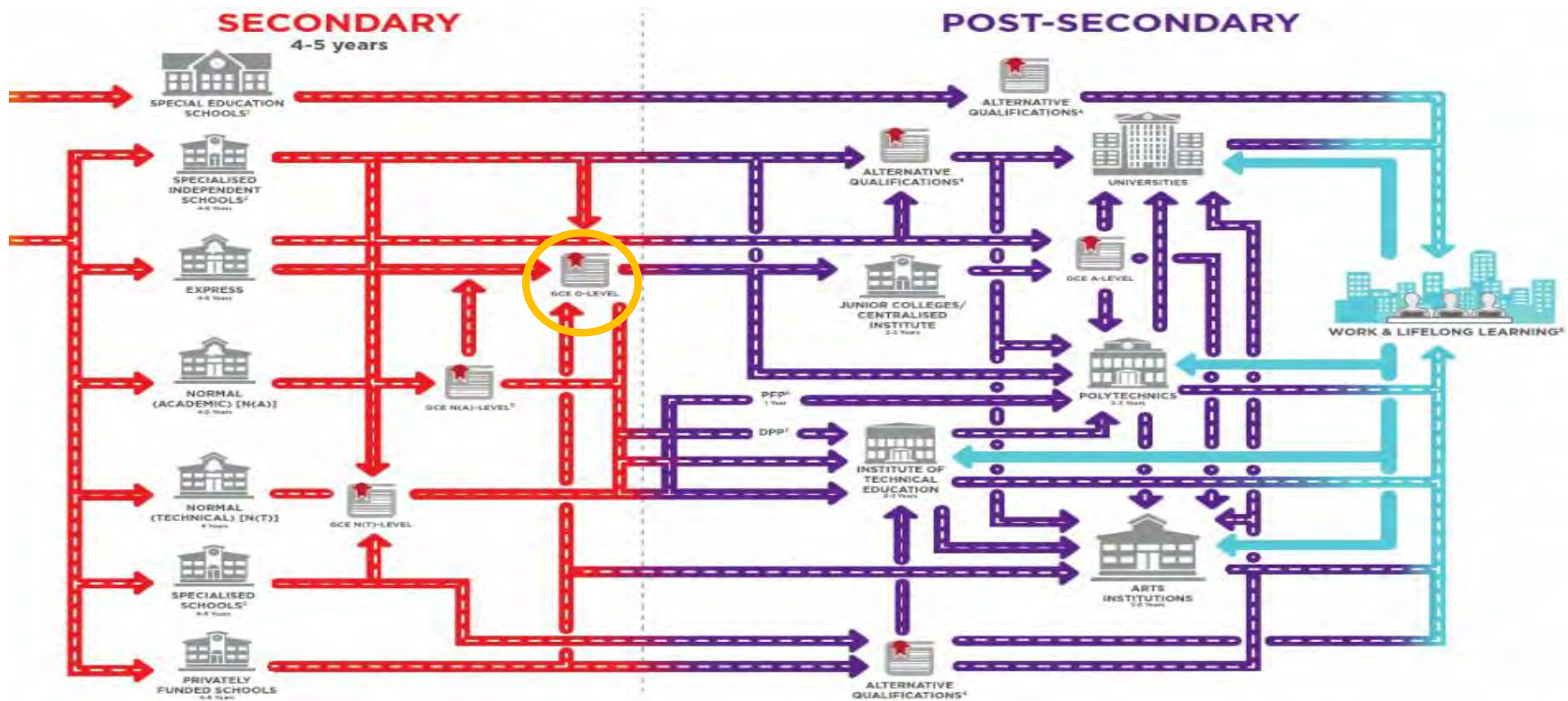

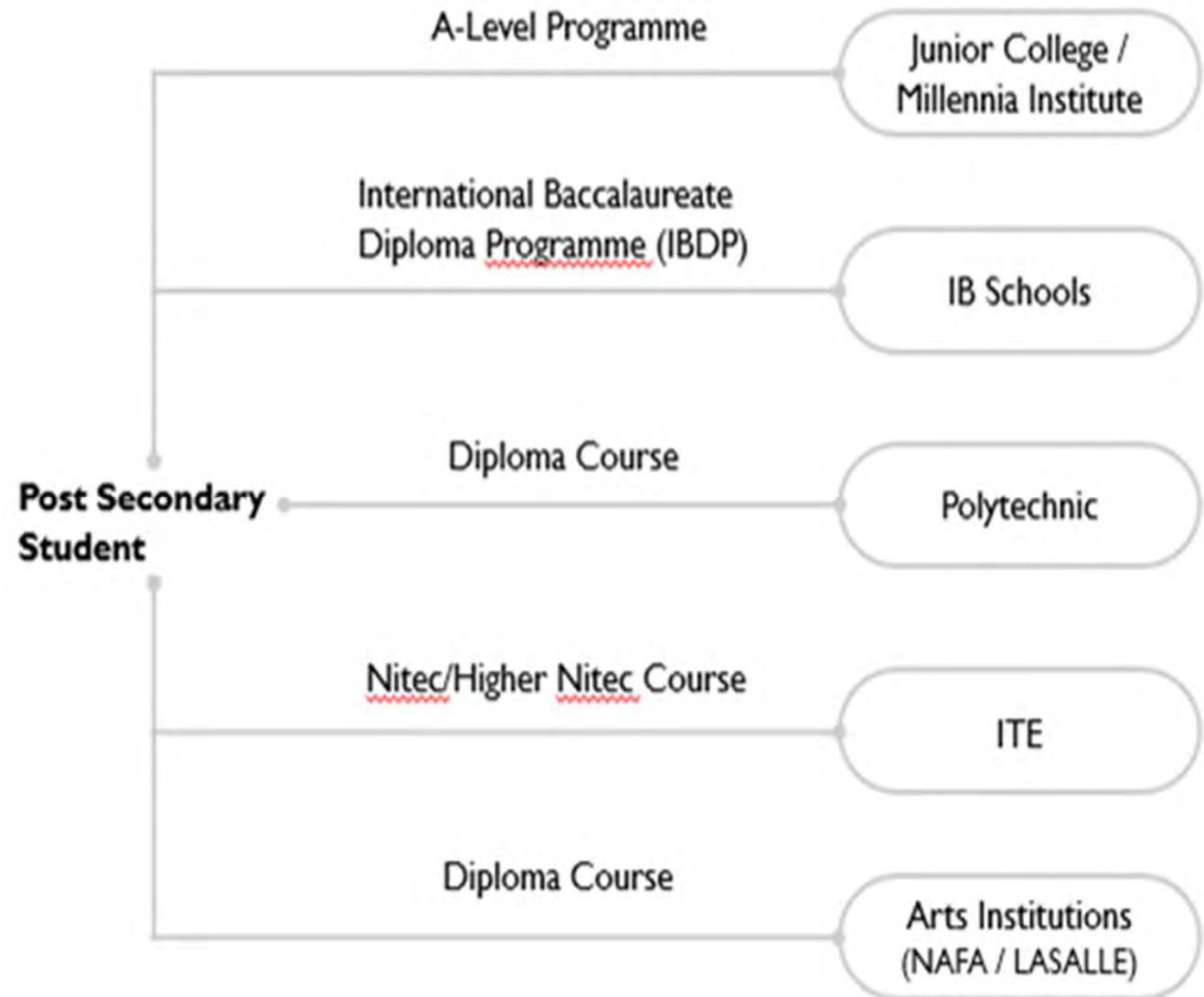

Criteria for conditional admission

If you have sat for the subject but **did not** obtain the minimum grade stated above, you are eligible for conditional admission when you meet one of these criteria:

- $L1R5 \leq 15$
- L1R5 from 16 to 20 and have grades of A1 or A2 in all the 5 relevant subjects

If you did not obtain the minimum required grade for an O-Level subject



You must resit for the subject and obtain the required grade by the end of Year 1 in JC. If you fail to do so, you will be transferred to Year 2 of a course in Millennia Institute (MI).

DSA-JC

About DSA-JC

- Direct School Admission-Junior College (DSA-JC) allows students to apply to a DSA-JC before taking the GCE O-Level examinations.
- The students can apply based on their talent in either academic or non-academic areas such as sports, CCAs, leadership and other areas of expertise, that may not be demonstrated at the O-Level examinations.

DSA-JC Talent Areas

- Refer to participating schools' websites for specific details as each school's requirements varies
- Some possible talent areas:-
 - Sports (e.g. Top 4 finish in zonal inter-school competitions) OR
 - Performing Arts (e.g. SYF participation and awards received) OR
 - Leadership* (e.g. school-wide leadership or record of effective leadership) OR
 - Debate (e.g. national or zonal competitions) OR
 - Academic (e.g. science research, mathematical Olympiads or proficiency/achievements in art/music/languages)

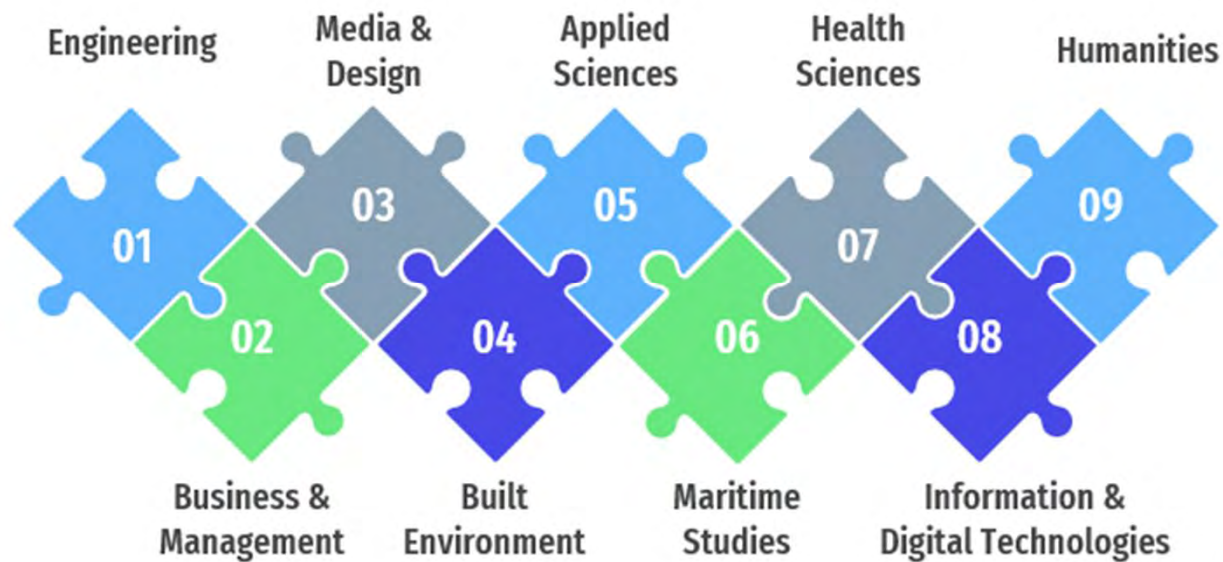

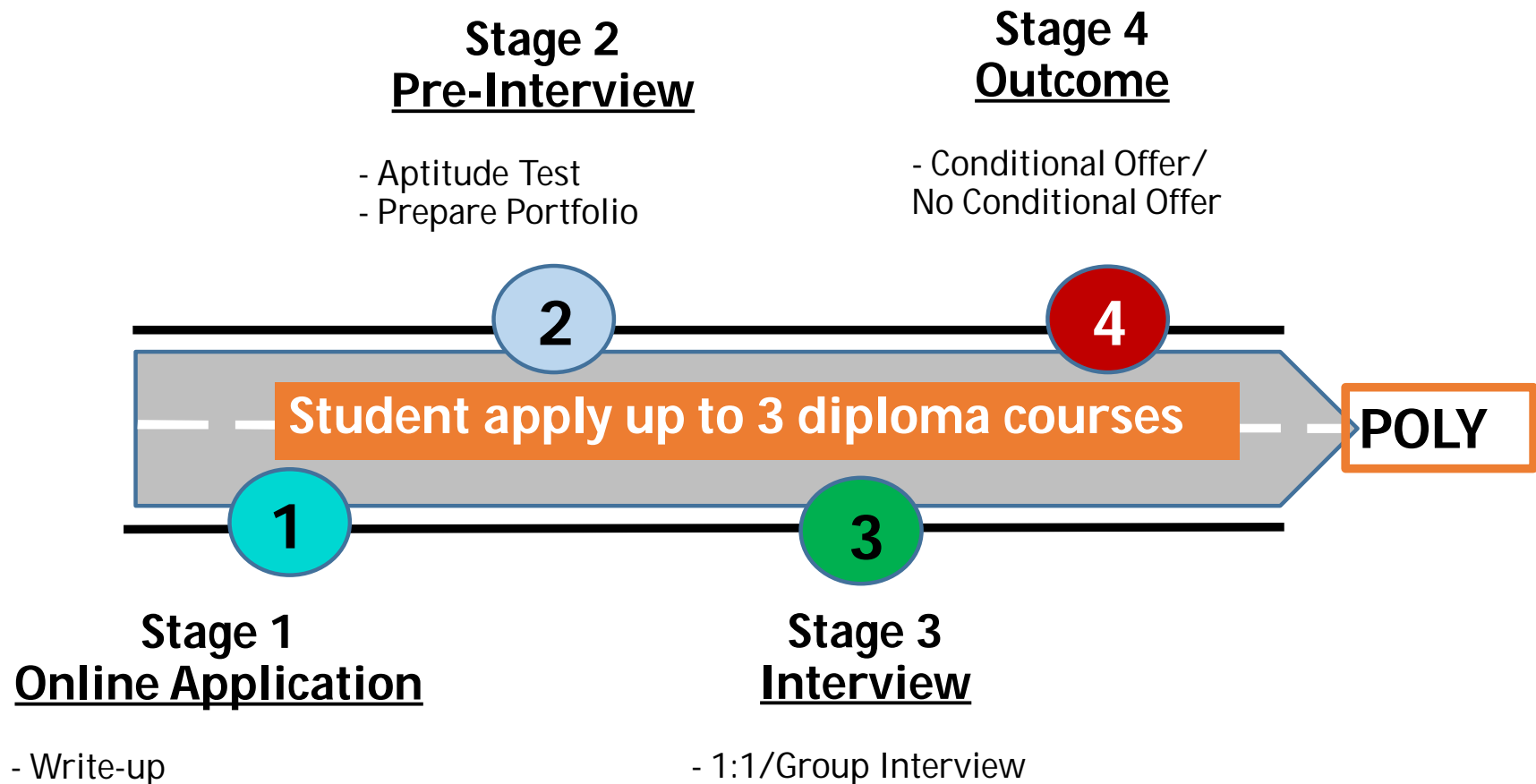

- All 5 polytechnics participate in Poly EAE

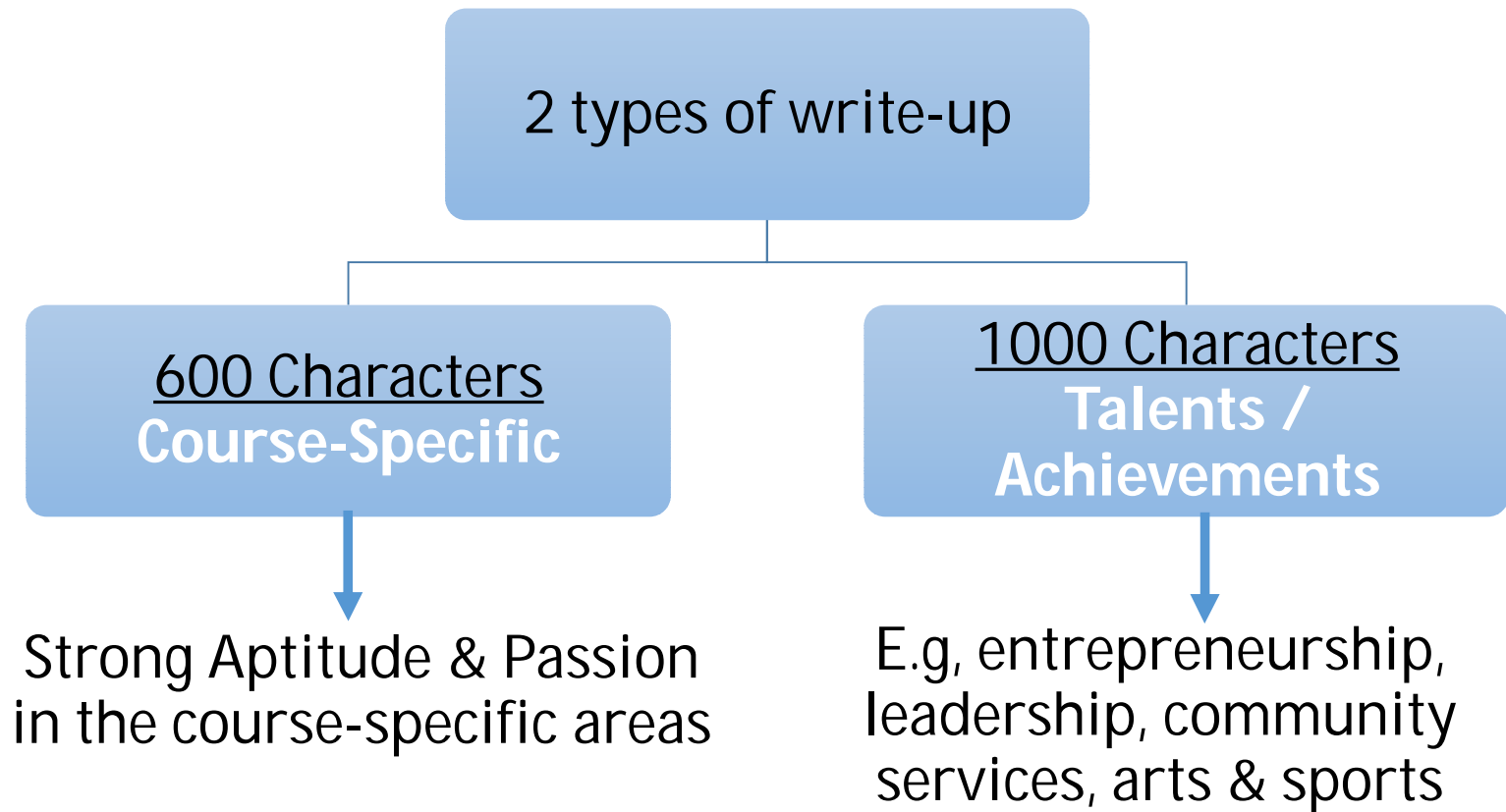
